To say there is only one issue within our world, would be to omit an evident truth. Our menacing kingdom is full of conflicts that make the most hopeful of souls doubt it will ever stop being grotesque. They make one wonder whether society or humanity's pernicious nature is to blame. While it becomes clear that there are many problems in need of solutions, it is imperative to consider what most originate from. The main issue at hand centers on human nature, specifically the vicious side of it. Many may claim it is impossible to change it but I ask those who do not believe , why give up on something and claim it is a failure if success was never attempted in the first place? By not trying , failure is no longer an option but a guarantee.

In the last 2-3 years, crime has increased in vast numbers. According to a NYPD report on Crime statistics as of July 2022, crime has increased by 30.5 percent, specifically looking at it from an overall index. "Citywide shooting incidents increased by 13.4% (178 v. 157), driven by upticks in Brooklyn, southern Queens, and Staten Island. Additionally, the number of murders citywide increased for the month by 34.3% compared to the same period last year" (NYPD). What makes this statistic sadder, is that many of the perpetrators are no longer just the sick bastards who take pleasure in committing crimes, but young teenagers who are easily manipulated into becoming inhumane offenders. Sometimes it starts out by stealing and when that is overlooked, the crimes begin to escalate. Confrontations turn into murder scenes, and a traumatic past becomes a serial killers motive to take innocent lives. Take Salvador Ramos for instance. He is responsible for a tragic incident that is now recognized both nationally and internationally. At only 18 years old, he murdered 19 students and 2 teachers at Robb Elementary School, which he formerly attended. He targeted his old 4th grade classroom. New information came to light regarding his upbringing in order to comprehend how such a young person could be capable of harming innocent children. According to interviews carried out by the FBI, Salvador Ramos "was born in Fargo, North Dakota, but moved to Uvalde as a child with his sister and mother, who struggled with a long history of drug use. A former girlfriend interviewed by the FBI said she believed the shooter had been sexually assaulted at an early age by one of the mother's boyfriends but that the mother didn't believe him" (Trevizo). Many might say that his trauma began when he was being sexually abused and bullied because of his speech impediment. "Family and friends told the committee he was bullied throughout the fourth grade over his stutter, short haircut and clothing. He often wore the same clothing day after day. One time, a girl tied his shoelaces together causing him to fall on his face, a cousin said" (Trevizo). As he grew up he became more violent, harrasing female collegues at his work place, and harassing his ex-girlfriend and her friends, as

well as positing online suicide videos and beheadings. He soon saved up money to buy rifles, and shins at the age of 17. Although this school shooter's story is sad and unfortunate, it does not justify the suffering and torture the students he killed suffered and the sorrow their parents are sufferring as of now. Because of these types of incidents it is necessary for public officials to take action and develop programs in which prevention is key. Hate crimes are another type of crime which have now increased alarmingly. Georgy Floyd, who passed away at the hand of police officers is one of the biggest hate crimes that has occurred recently and marked a historical event in which racism continues to be battled. Another targeted group are religious groups. The cultural and racial differences have continued to split our world. Incidents such as the Laguna Wood shooting that occurred May 12th of this year at a Prebystreian church, which are provoked by racial differences, leave far too many injured and innocent people dead. Nowadays one can't leave their house without the fear of something bad happening to them and having to be alert every second of the day because, no matter where you are, whether it be in a supermarket, at a 7-Eleven, a place of worship, at a school, or salon, you can be a target. Even those who are in charge of maintaining order in their countries tend to fall in the wrong track and are responsible for committing crimes behind closed doors. If they already have so much power and are able to have so much money, how much more can they want? The selfish part of human nature dominates them and gives way to corruption.

While all of these crimes may stem from different reasons, one can argue that the savage part of human nature gives way to those reasons.
